Regarding Information evening about large-scale work on the Amstelveen Line

Dear residents, traders,

The Amstelveen Line, tram line 51, is being renewed, and will become a safe, fast and more reliable connection between Westwijk and Amsterdam South. For this, from late September our main contractor VITAL will commence large-scale work on Beneluxbaan, at the intersections with Rembrandtweg and Zonnestein. This is needed to create room for the construction of split-level crossings. The work includes felling of trees, filling up and re-digging of waterways, installing pumps to transport ground water, relocating Beneluxbaan (the road will be moved slightly outwards) and constructing a temporary tram stop.

Information evening: come and see us!

On Thursday 13 September we will organise an information evening about the work, the overall planning of the project and how local public transport will change once tram line 51, in its current form, will stop running, from March 2019. You are most welcome to come and see us: Thursday 13 September, between 18.30 and 21.00, at Cultuurcentrum Griffioen, Uilenstede 106, Amstelveen. Just walk in, there is no need to register.

Unable to attend on the 13th? Afterwards, the information will be available in the information centre 'Amstelveen InZicht'. Later this year, we will organise information sessions about work along other sections of the Amstelveen Line.
